

Superimposing using Photoshop

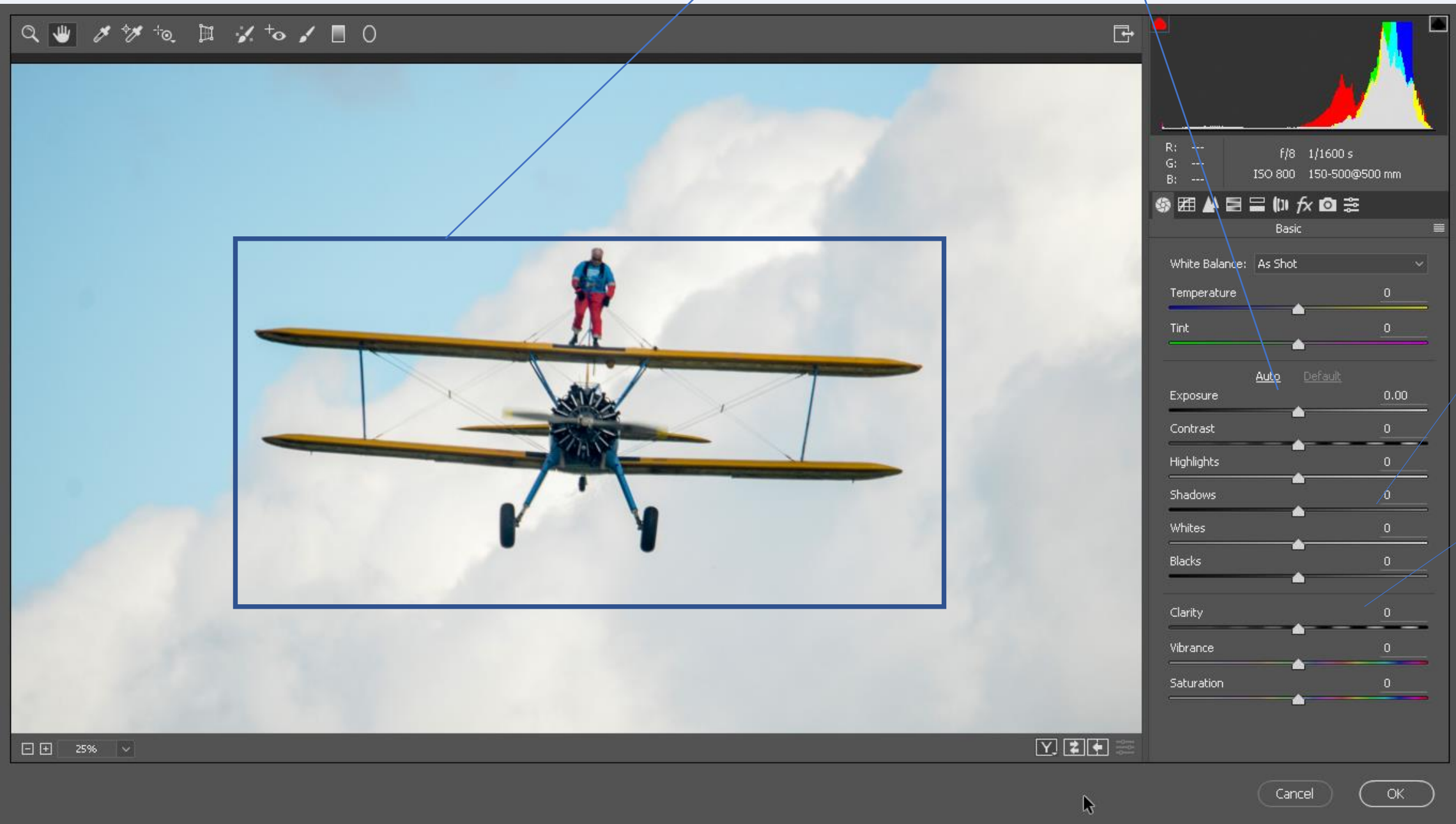
Main Functions to be used:

- **Camera Raw**
- **Cropping**
- **Selecting Using Magic Wand Tool**
- **Masking & Feathering**
- **Copying to New Layers**
- **Erasing Unwanted bits evenly**
- **Merging Layers**

Stage 1: Open and adjust in Camera Raw

1. Crop image

2. Try Auto as a start point



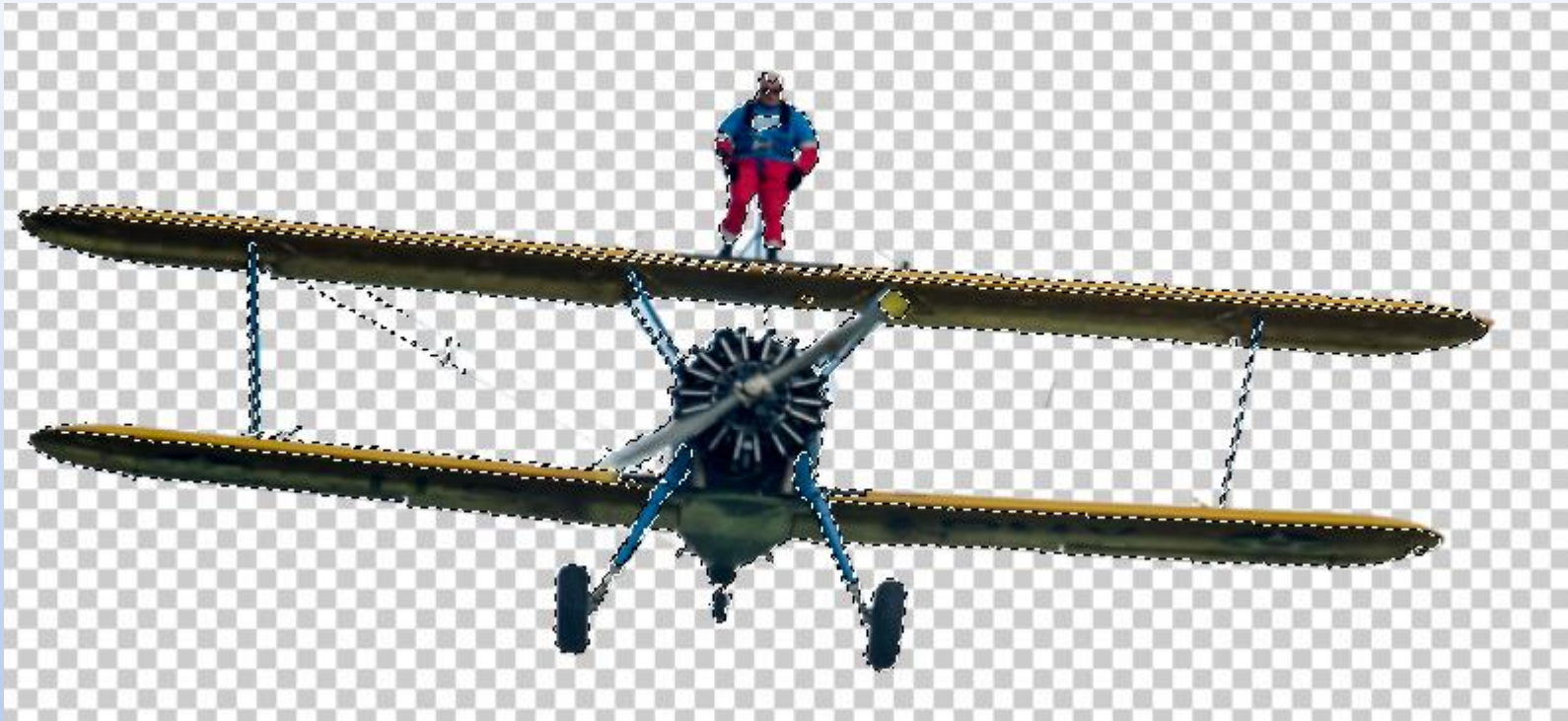
3. Make More Adjustments

4. Use Clarity Then sharpen

Don't go crazy



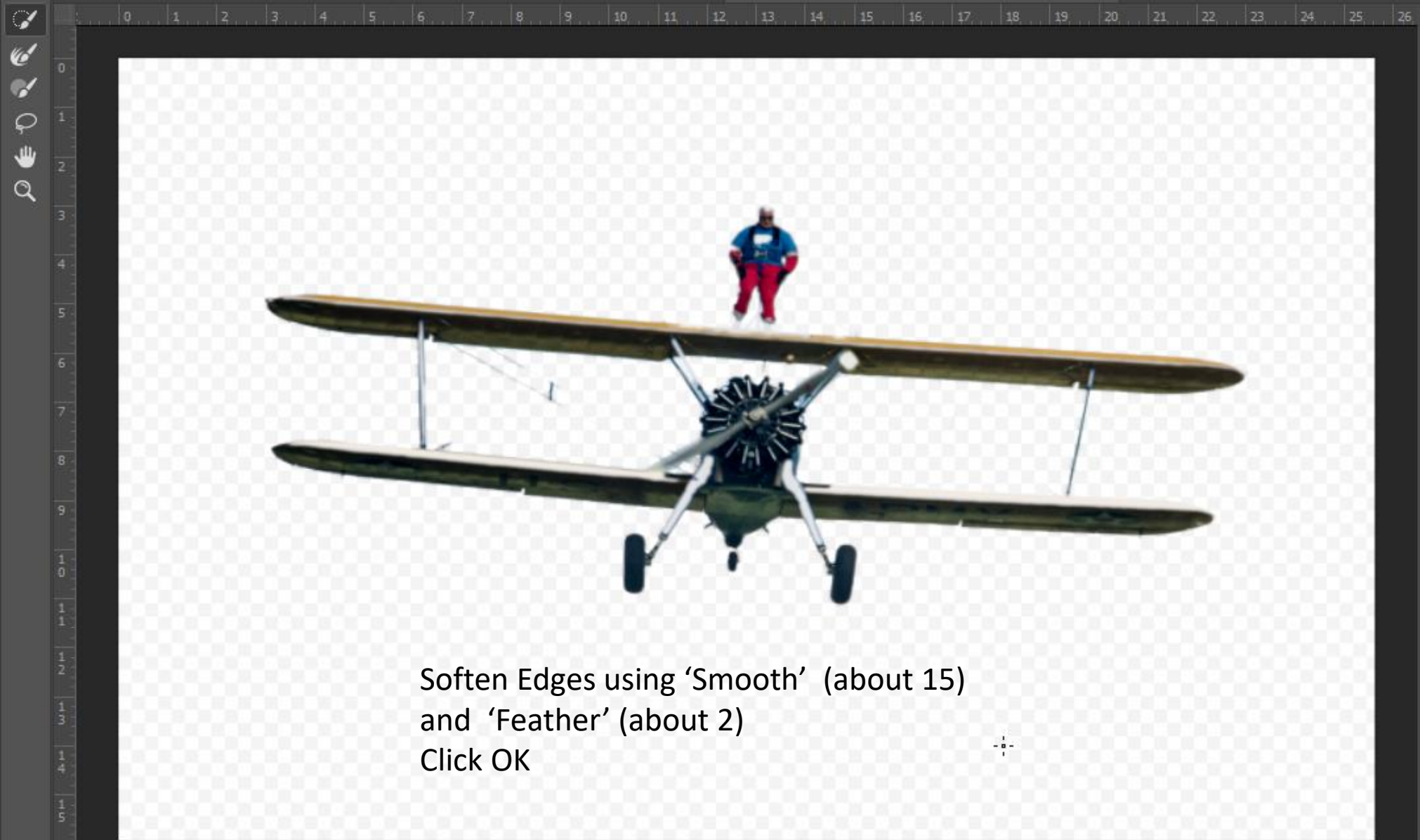
Use Magic Wand to select desired area



Use Shift + Magic Wand or any selection option

Make sure there are no holes

Choose Select & Mask Option in function toolbar



Soften Edges using 'Smooth' (about 15)
and 'Feather' (about 2)
Click OK

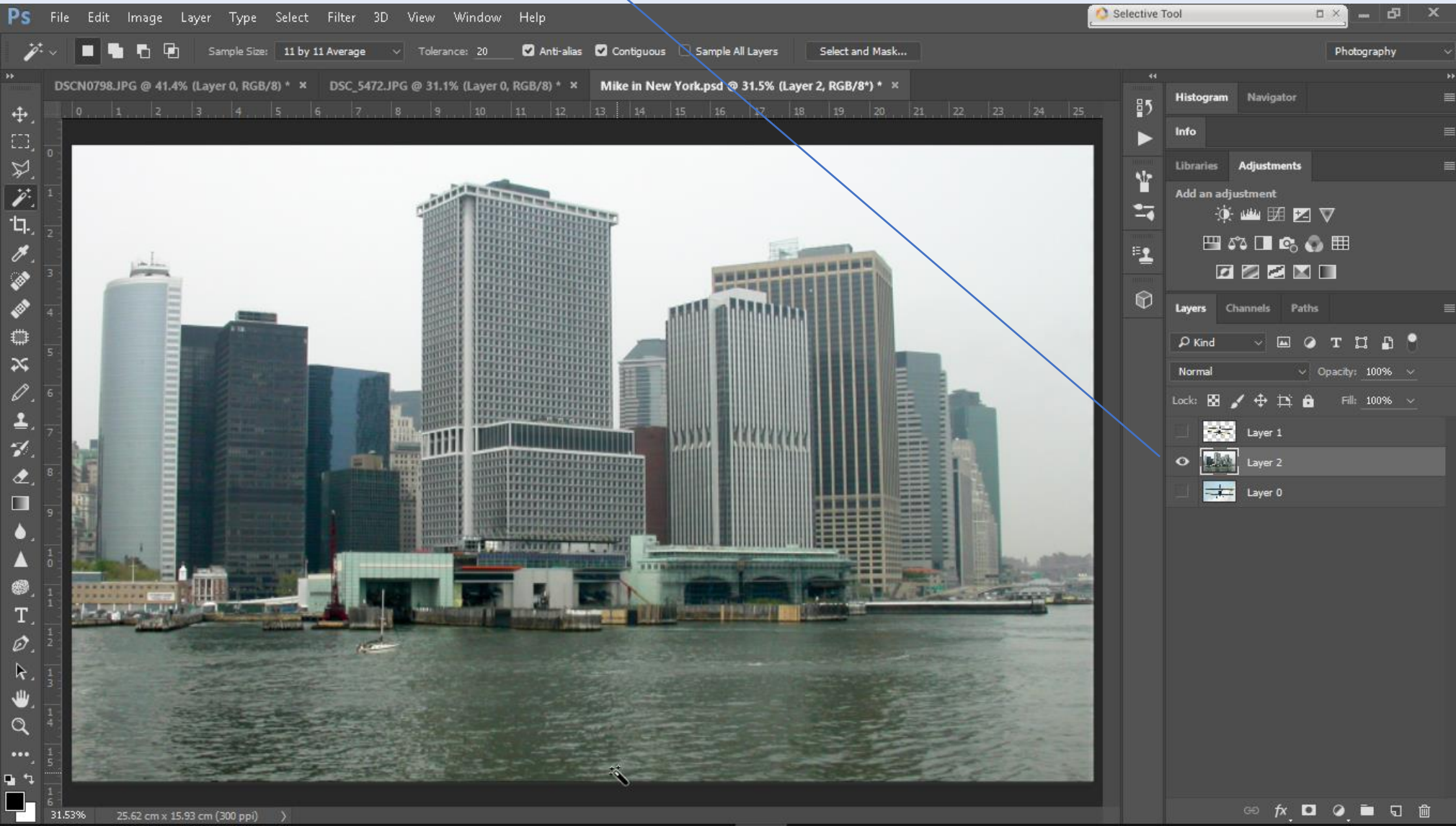

Adjust as necessary.
E.G. straighten, increase contrast etc.

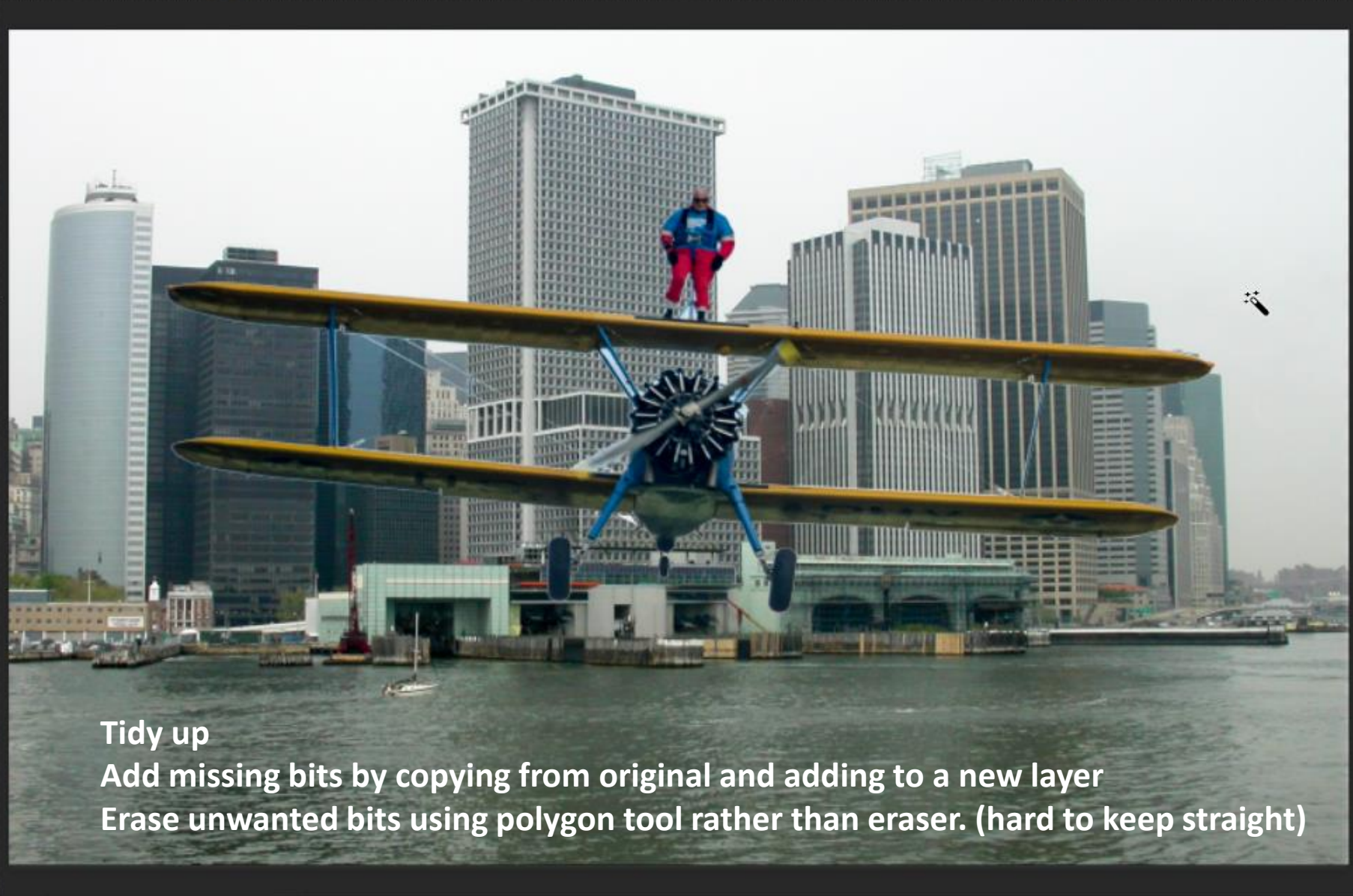

Add missing bits by copying from original and adding to a new layer
Erase unwanted bits using polygon tool rather than eraser. (hard to keep straight)
